If you have any queries or concerns about the next academic year or our uniform requirements, please do not hesitate to ring the office to speak to me or make an appointment to see me. My door is always open.

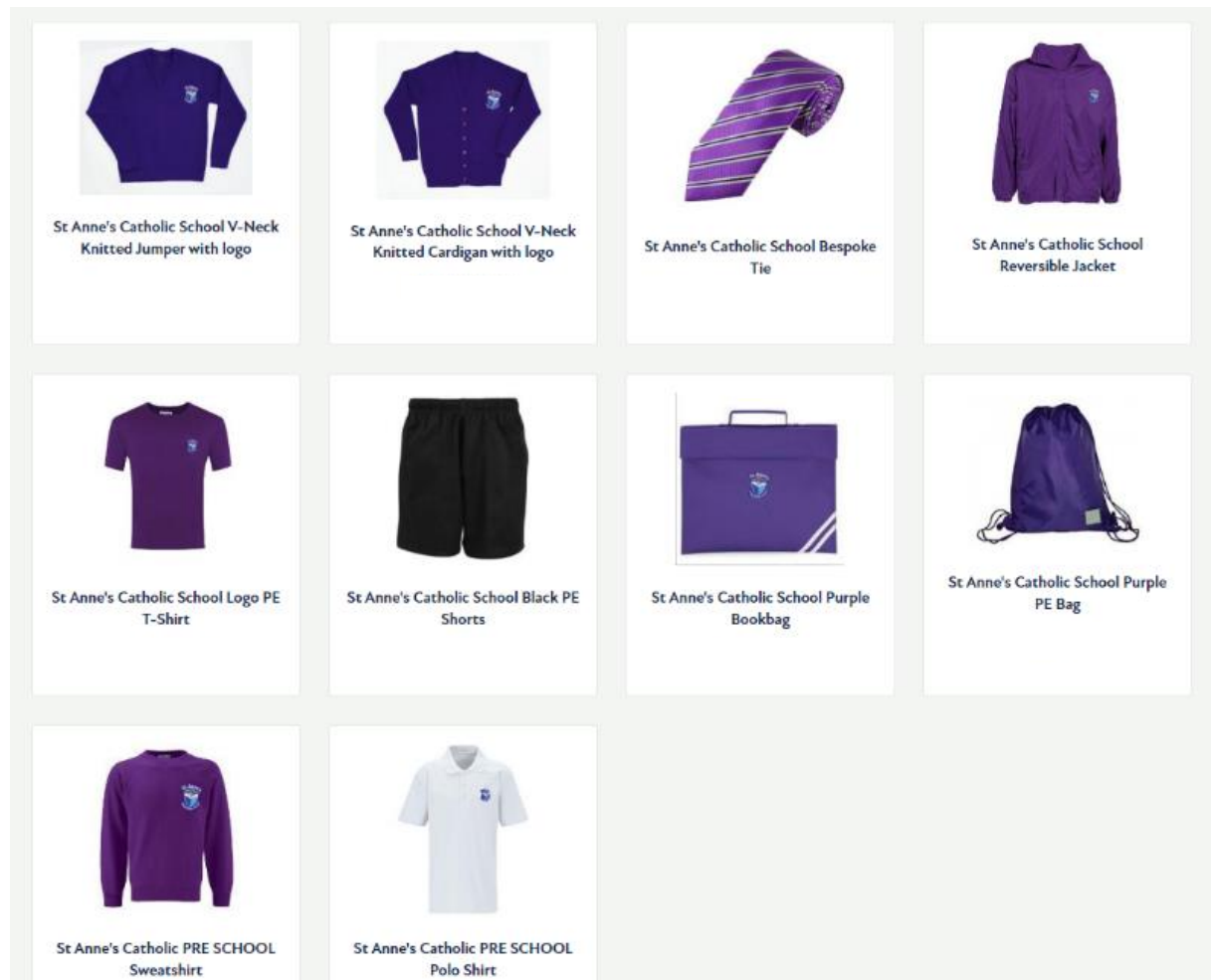

Boys



Black Trousers

White Short or Long Sleeve Shirt

Embroidered Purple V Neck Knitted Jumper

Plain White / Black Socks

Sensible Black Shoes (**no trainers**)

Clip on Tie

Girls



Black Skirt (not shorter than knee length) or Black Trousers (full length not $\frac{3}{4}$ / no leggings)

White Short or Long Sleeve Shirt

Embroidered Purple V Neck Knitted Jumper or Embroidered Purple Knitted Cardigan

Black Tights / Socks

Sensible Black Shoes (no heels or trainers).

Clip on Tie

Hair

Girls should tie long hair neatly back with unfussy bands / bobbles / slides to avoid it being pulled or caught especially during PE. Boys should have neat short hair without tramlines. Extreme haircuts / colours are not permitted.

Jewellery

The wearing of any kind of jewellery in school is prohibited. The school cannot be held responsible for any lost items. Children who wish their ears to be pierced should wait until the beginning of the summer holidays, after which the earrings can safely be removed while in school. It is not permissible to cover earrings with a sticking plaster. Children may wear a watch but this must be removed during PE lessons.
